I have lived on Garfield Avenue since 1989, and have seen many changes in our neighborhood. This is a peaceful residential community, and the feeling is family friendly. There are already a lot of cars that speed down our street, as it is a through-way from Washington all the way down to Mountain. The few required stops help to keep the street fairly safe, and many people keep in mind that there are pedestrians crossing at odd places, and sometimes children playing in the street. With the few stop signs being observed, it is still a family friendly environment, and safe for kids and adults to cross the street at the corners.

However, Adena Street is another story. It is just about exactly four car widths wide, with no space to spare. If cars are parked on both sides of the street, there is just about enough room for 2 small cars heading in either direction to safely manage to drive at the same time. However, if you add another stream of traffic from these 9 family units, each possibly contributing several cars worth of traffic per unit in both directions, it will add an unsafe additional burden of traffic to navigate on this **very narrow street**.

I am unable to attend the meeting, as I cannot drive at night, but I did want to let you know about the dangers of adding the additional traffic to Adena and Garfield Streets. Thank you for your time.
