In the email when the people signed up it clearly states drive thru only several signs were put all around the outside and inside of the store to help prevent them from coming in but the people didn't listen and exposed us to covid several times. We sometimes had to use our own supplies from the store because cvs couldn't give any because they were out that then put customers out of stuff!

Even to today we still have testers come inside and ask or say I am here for my test! Still exposing others and with us now doing vaccines it's extremely important to have our care taken care of.

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Dear Chairman Hampton and Committee Members,

Pasadena has just entered the red tier. Restrictions are being eased because infection rates are lowering dramatically.

At the same time, vaccines are available to a wider segment of our population-including grocery workers.

We are all safer now, including our workforce.

Now is the time to allow business to settle into a more regular pattern and decide how they can best adapt to the new protocols.

It is not the time to increase employee costs for any business. Certainly not when those employees are working in a safer environment than they were in January and February.

Many grocery stores have already raised pay for their workers to help adjust for more rigorous working conditions that resulted from COVID-19 safety protocols. Do you really want to punish these employers by layering additional unnecessary costs onto their payroll.

For the City of Pasadena, it is inviting a lawsuit, as you are aware. Passage could also lead to store closings, as we have seen in other localities.

There is no justification for Pasadena imposing hazard pay costs onto your grocery stores at this time.

Please do not do this.
