1. Pasadena to Make Power Supply Mix Available Online and by Mail:

The Pasadena Water and Power (“PWP”) energy portfolio consists of a variety of sources. This diversified power mix enables PWP to keep rates low in the event of a sudden price increase of a particular resource, and ensures PWP will be able to deliver reliable service to its customers at affordable rates.

According to Gurcharan Bawa, Interim General Manager, the California Energy Commission (“CEC”) currently requires utilities to create a Power Content Label (“PCL”) that includes the utilities’ actual power supply mix for the prior year, as well as an overview of the state’s power mix. In accordance with CEC guidelines, the PCL is prepared annually, submitted to the CEC, and published on PWP’s website for customers to access online. The CEC approved a new regulation on July 13, 2016 that – pending final approval from the California Office of Administrative Law – will now require PWP to additionally provide the PCL to its customers by mail. Once approved, PWP will include the PCL in a utility bill insert by the end of the year, in hopes to encourage customers to learn more about Pasadena’s power supply mix. Pasadena to Make Power Supply Mix Available Online and By Mail

The Pasadena Water and Power ("PWP") energy portfolio consists of a variety of sources. This diversified power mix enables PWP to keep rates low in the event of a sudden price increase of a particular resource, and ensures PWP will be able to deliver reliable service to its customers at affordable rates.

The California Energy Commission ("CEC") currently requires utilities to create a Power Content Label ("PCL") that includes the utilities' actual power supply mix for the prior year, as well as an overview of the state's power mix. In accordance with CEC guidelines, the PCL is prepared annually, submitted to the CEC, and published on PWP's website for customers to access online. The CEC approved a new regulation on July 13, 2016 that – pending final approval from the California Office of Administrative Law – will now require PWP to additionally provide the PCL to its customers by mail. Once approved, PWP will include the PCL in a utility bill insert by the end of the year, in hopes to encourage customers to learn more about Pasadena's power supply mix. PWP is committed to ensuring the energy portfolio is not only progressive and diverse but continues to provide reliable energy at affordable rates. In May 2016, the 20 megawatt (MW) Kingbird "A" Solar Project ("Kingbird") was commissioned. The Kingbird power purchase contract will provide Pasadena with approximately 56,000 megawatt-hours (MWh) of renewable solar power each year for the next 20 years. This is equivalent to the average annual energy consumption of about 9,400 Pasadena homes. In addition to Kingbird, PWP has secured contracts with several other solar facilities and a landfill gas-to energy project that will help increase PWP's renewable portfolio by an additional 30 MW. The addition of the new 71 MW combined cycle unit, GT-5, at the Glenarm Power Plant will also help diversify Pasadena's renewable portfolio.

Pasadena is making great progress in embracing renewable energy while balancing its portfolio with conventional energy sources. These projects ensure that PWP is well underway to achieving the goal of 40% renewable energy by 2020 and 50% by 2030, which is part the City's long-term Power Integrated Resources Plan ("IRP"). 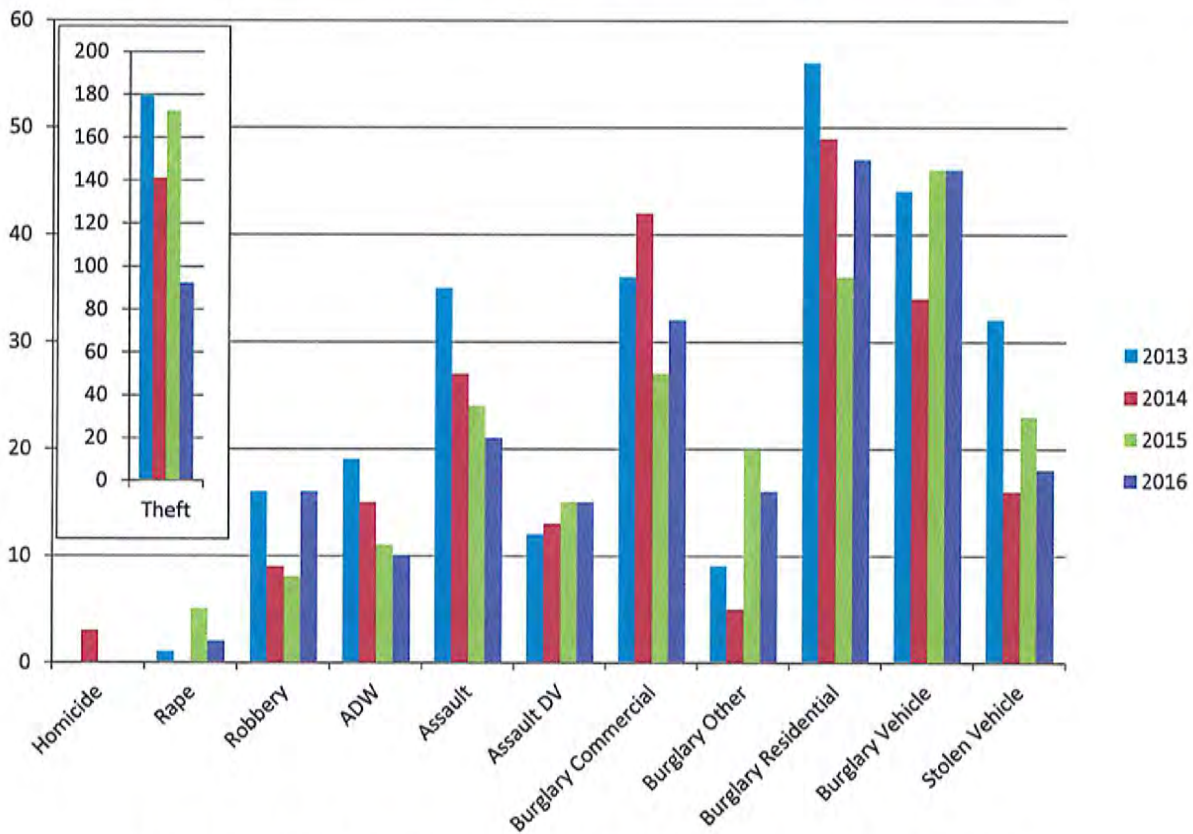

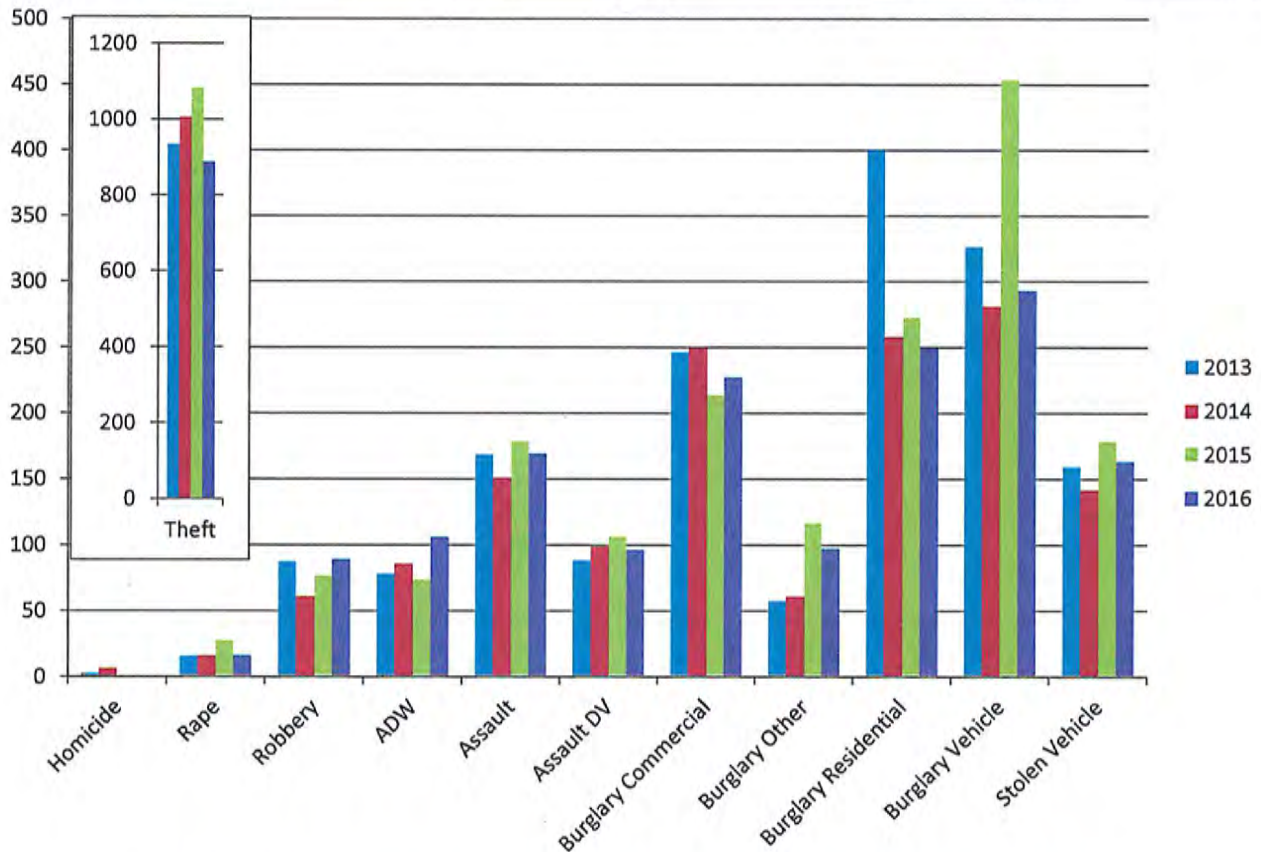
