1. **ArtNight Pasadena “Best Cultural Festival,” Returns Friday, April 29th!**

A multiple past recipient of the Pasadena Weekly’s “Best Cultural Festival” award, *ArtNight Pasadena* is a signature cultural tourism event that is produced by the City’s Cultural Affairs Division in collaboration with the *ArtNight* partner organizations. David M. Reyes, Director of Planning & Community Development, is pleased to announce that after almost two years of nearly exclusively virtual programming, Spring *ArtNight* will include 15 in-person venues and two virtual participating partners. Lively art, dance, music, videos, and other performances will engage audiences in person and/or online from 6:00 to 10:00 pm. on Friday, April 29, 2022.

ArtNight Pasadena welcomes two new partner organizations this spring. Alkebu-lan Cultural Center will present the visual artworks of Charles Bibbs and Maurice Howard, with music, crafts for kids and storytelling while Reminders Creative Reuse will offer mask-making crafts for all ages, motion drawing and a gallery show.

Other in-person *ArtNight* events focus on visual art, including the Armory Center for the Arts exhibition “how we are in time and space,” with artists Nancy Buchanan, Marcia Hafif and Barbara T. Smith; the USC Pacific Asia Museum’s celebration of Pakistan’s arts and culture; and an exhibition of annual student scholarship projects at the Pasadena City College Gallery.

Several other in-person venues invite audiences for participatory events: a “Paint Out” at the Gamble House in partnership with the California Art Club will feature live models in period costumes for artists and everyone to draw; the Pasadena Playhouse offers a chance to create improvised stories and characters with “Improv for Actors” teaching artists; and Red Hen Press solicits contributions to the community art wall, creation of black-out poetry and an opportunity to write a 1-page story.

Celebrate April Arts Month with Theatre Americana's "Spring Wing Ding – or Hop 'til you Drop" musical excerpts at City Hall and make a spring garden craft project. Other live music and dance performances can also be found at the Lineage Performing Arts Center (advance free tickets required) and at Shumei Arts Council where Makoto Taiko returns.

History will be highlighted at the Pasadena Museum of History's exhibition "Starting Anew: Transforming Pasadena 1890-1930," which examines the City's unparalleled growth from an agricultural community. Take a trip back into time with live radio theatre at Parson's Nose Theater to relive golden oldies including *The Shadow!*, *The Lone Ranger!*, and *Flash Gordon!*

No Boundaries 17, PUSD's annual student artwork exhibition from K-12, is presented in collaboration with Side Street Projects and includes live performances at Paseo Colorado. Both indoor and outdoor performances can be found at artWORKS Teen Center, along with the GroWORKS garden and hands-on art making.

Two virtual venues include Art Center College of Design's "A 40-day Pilgrimage Along the U.S.-Mexico Border" and Muse/Ique's celebration of the 2022 season of Los Angeles music, led by Artistic Director Rachel Worby, and featuring highlights from OFFSTAGE and MUSE-IQUE In a Minute!

The City's Arts and Culture Commission funds Mini-grants to allow small arts groups and individual artists to participate. Each venue has Braille version of the *ArtNight* brochure and many venues, including City Hall, will have food trucks on site. 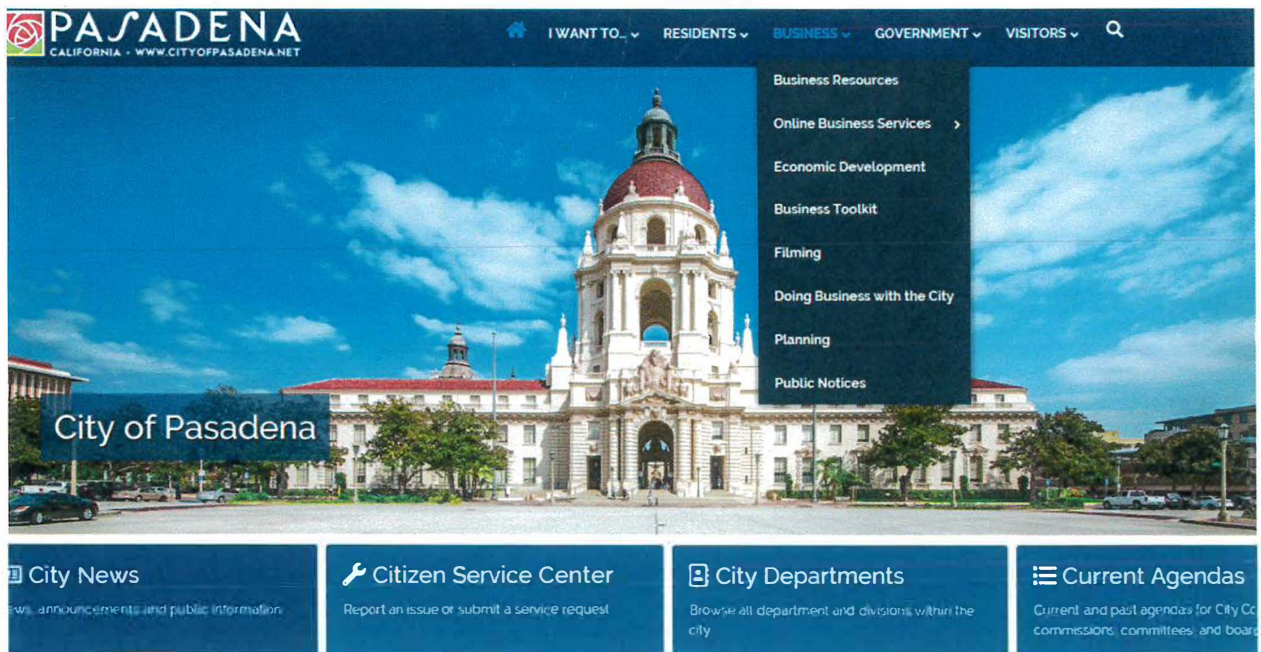

Bids will be received electronically through Planet Bids (www.planetbids.com) prior to 2:00 pm on Thursday, May 19, 2022. A bid received after the time set for the bid opening shall not be considered. Bidders are required to submit (upload) all items listed in the BIDDER'S CHECKLIST including acknowledgement of all addendums; AND the full Bidder's Proposal as a PDF file.

From time to time, the City finds it necessary to issue addendum(a) to bid specifications after those bid specifications have been released. Only those parties that have registered with the City as a plan holder on a particular project will receive the addendum(a) for that project. The City is not responsible for notifications to those parties who do not directly register as a plan holder on the City's database. It is the responsibility of all perspective bidders to register on the City's database to ensure receipt of any addendum(a) prior to bid submittals. Additionally, information on any addendum(a) issued for any bid specifications for any project will be available on the City website at: <https://www.planetbids.com/portal/portal.cfm?CompanyID=14770> The City reserves the right to reject as nonresponsive any bid that fails to include the information required by any addendum(a) posted on the City website. Each Bidder must hold an active Class A License.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 1770 to 1782 of the California Labor Code, the California Department of Industrial Relations has ascertained the general prevailing rate of wages in the county in which work is to be done. A copy of the general prevailing rate of wages is on file with the City Engineer and is available for inspection and reference during regular business hours.

The administrative fees is \$344.28 (Non-Refundable), and deposit of \$30,000 (Refundable).

All Bidder's questionnaires and/or request for equal substitution requests shall be submitted to City's Project Manager, Teddy Luong, via email at tuong@cityofpasadena.net by 5:00 PM on May 5, 2022. Any questions or substitution request received after 5:00 PM on May 5, 2022 will not be considered. All addendum will be responded by May 12, 2022.

A contractor or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid on, be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of this public works project unless currently registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Labor Code Section 1725.5. It is not a violation of Labor Code Section 1771.1 for an unregistered contractor to submit a bid that is authorized by Section 7029.1 of the Business and Professions Code or by Section 10164 or 20103.5 of the Public Contract Code, provided the contractor is registered to perform public work pursuant to Section 1725.5 at the time the contract is awarded.

This Project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.

The Contractor must post job site notices prescribed by regulation (See e.g. 8 Cal. Code Reg. Section 16451(d)).

Contractors and Subcontractors must furnish electronic certified payroll records directly to the California Labor Commissioner (aka Division of Labor Standards Enforcement).

Electronic Bid bond is required. Bidders must provide all required information for the city to verify the bond with their bid (PDF file). The bond must meet the following requirements and characteristics: Bid security in the amount of five percent (5%) of the total bid price in the form of a redeemable or callable electronic surety bond, meeting City requirements, must accompany all bids. If the Bidder to whom the contract is awarded shall for fifteen (15) calendar days after such award fail or neglect to enter into the contract with the required insurance documentation and the Construction & Demolition Waste Management Plan, and file the required bonds, the City may deposit in its treasury said bid security and, under no circumstances, shall it be returned to the defaulting Bidder. Failure to return signed contract with all the attachments stated above may result in having the project awarded to the next lowest bidder.

Refer to the Specifications for complete details and bid requirements. Specifications and this notice shall be considered a part of any contract made pursuant thereto.
