

DECLARATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Director of Disaster Emergency Services, and pursuant to Chapter 2.370 of the Pasadena Municipal Code, including specifically Section 2.370.080, I hereby find that the following conditions exist:

- (A) There has been widespread arson, looting, assaults, vandalism and rioting in the adjacent City of Los Angeles, and other nearby cities since May 30, 2020, and continuing to the present. Since at least May 28, 2020, there has also been widespread arson, looting, assaults, vandalism and rioting stemming from public demonstrations in numerous other cities throughout California and across the country. Peaceful demonstrations are essential to our democratic system. However, some individuals have engaged in dangerous and unlawful activity, threatening the safety of lawful demonstrators, surrounding communities, and first responders.

- (B) The above conditions constitute the existence of conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the City of Pasadena, which conditions are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the City of Pasadena and require the combined forces of other political subdivisions to combat.

NOW, THEREFORE, I HEREBY DECLARE the existence of a local emergency within the City of Pasadena, which shall take effect immediately, and that widespread publicity and notice shall be given of said declaration through the most feasible and adequate means of disseminating such notice throughout the City.

I FURTHER DECLARE AND ORDER that during the existence of said local emergency the powers, functions and duties of the emergency organizations of the City of Pasadena shall be those proscribed by state law and the charter, ordinances, resolutions and approved plans of the City of Pasadena.

I FURTHER REQUEST that the Governor declare the City of Pasadena to be in a state of emergency.

CURFEW REGULATIONS

(Pursuant to Declaration of Local Emergency of _____, 2020)

It shall be unlawful for any person to travel or be upon a public street, sidewalk, or public place within the City of Pasadena during the dates and hours designated below, unless exempt for the reasons set forth below. For purposes of this Curfew, "travel" includes, without limitation, travel on foot, bicycle, skateboard, scooter, motorcycle, automobile, or public transit.

May 30, 2020 from 8:00 p.m. until 5:30 a.m. May 31, 2020

Exemptions: All law enforcement, fire, medical personnel, and members of the news media are exempt from this Curfew. Individuals traveling directly to and from work, seeking emergency care, fleeing dangerous circumstances, or experiencing homelessness are also exempt.
