On behalf of the City of Pasadena's Accessibility & Disability Commission, this communication reflects our experience and observation of the accessibility accommodations and services of the Rose Bowl while attending a recent concert as guests of the Rose Bowl Operating Company.

Prior to the event, Commissioners Martin Sweeney (chair) and Cy Estabrook (Vice -chair) met with the city's Accessibility Issues Coordinator Ali Everett, Rose Bowl COO George Cunningham and staff members Margo Mavridis and Brian Gomez to review Rose Bowl Accessibility and recent improvements made to the facility. Those improvements included:

- A "Special Accommodations" section to the Rose Bowl pocket employee handbook
- Accommodation updates to the Rose Bowl website
- Maintenance of a log of accommodation requests received in advance of events
- Annual staff training re proper response to ADA accommodation requests

Commissioners Sweeney and Estabrook with Accessibility Issues Coordinator Everett attended the BTS concert on Sunday on May 5, 2019 to observe and detail accessibility accommodations. We were requested to observe the following stadium and Pavilion amenities:

- Accessible parking
- Ticket exchange for accessible seats
- First Aid Station
- Restrooms
- Drinking fountains
- Concession stands
- Seating
- Customer service provided to patrons with disabilities

Overall, Commissioners Sweeney and Estabrook found that the Rose Bowl met, with minor exceptions, ADA requirements. (A more detailed listing was compiled by Accessibility Issues Coordinator Everett.) The following recommendations were noted:

- Ticket exchange counter height
- Bathrooms:
 - Additional signage identifying Accessible stalls. Perhaps signage on each accessible stall door would help make accessible stalls more obvious and underscore the purpose, importance and value of such accommodation.

- Placement of trash receptacles must not impede wheelchair access. This is often commonly overlooked and unenforced at public facilities. (The ADA requires that trash receptacles may not encroach on the clear floor space that must be provided in front of elements such as sinks and paper towel dispensers.)
- The Accessible Gate from Lot B, where guests wait for the event to open, could have some signage directing patrons to the closest accessible restrooms. This would be a nice convenience for people who may have waited awhile for the gates to open.

Last, it should be noted that the attending staff—from parking lot personnel to facility management—were informed, friendly, helpful and accommodating. The attitude expressed by concessionaires, elevator operators, ushers and staff were more than accommodating. While ADA enforcement is always an ongoing process, we feel it is important to note that the single most important and foundational element is a commitment—personally and institutionally—to the values of accessibility and inclusion. And to this end, we believe the Rose Bowl and its staff should be commended. We look forward to working with the Rose Bowl to insure the best possible experience for all—including patrons with disabilities and their friends and families.
