Declaring October as LGBTQ+ History Month

WHEREAS, the path towards LGBTQ+ equality and liberation has been paved by Americans who have had the courage to stand up and fight for their basic human right to love and be loved; and

WHEREAS, on June 4th, 2019, California State Governor Gavin Newsom recognized LGBTQ Pride Month in the State of California stating we must demand equal rights for all to create a California for all; and

WHEREAS, the History-Social Science Content Standards for California Public Schools, Kindergarten through Grade Twelve, states the importance for students to consider the ways in which the quests for liberty, freedom, and equality have transformed the American populace, and how these rights and privileges have been contested and reshaped over time; and

WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ Americans have made, and continue to make, positive and long-lasting contributions to society by advancing areas of diversity, inclusion, equity, and respect; and

WHEREAS, California has been a pioneer in providing extensive protections for LGBTQ+ people under California law, as demonstrated through the *Gay Law Students Assn. v. Pacific Tel. & Tel.* where the California Supreme Court held that public institutions cannot discriminate against homosexuals as it violates the State constitution. This paved way for California to pass Proposition 8 in 2008, acting as the second state to grant same-sex marriages; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, California State Board of Education unanimously approved new social studies curriculum to include the evolutions of gay rights and the contributions of LGBTQ+ figures in history; thereby implementing SB 48 – Fair Education Act, signed into law by Governor Jerry Brown in 2011 that prohibits discrimination in education and ensures contributions of Americans from all backgrounds and walks of life are included in history;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Pasadena Unified School District Board of Education (PUSD) recognizes the importance of LGBTQ+ History Month as an effective means of educating and calling to action the citizens of Pasadena to work together to promote equality to all PUSD students and staff regardless of sexual preference or gender identity. PUSD encourages all schools, administrations, teachers, and staff to observe LGBTQ+ History Month in October for each school year, by utilizing inclusive and affirming educational materials, including those available through LGBTQ+ resource centers such as [GLSEN](#) (Gay, Lesbian, Straight Education Network), [the Guardian Teacher Network](#), [Welcoming Schools](#), and the [SGV LGBTQ Center](#), to highlight exemplary role models from the LGBTQ+ community and its historical fight for equality. By showcasing the civil rights pioneers who have played a critical

role in American history, the observance of LGBTQ+ History Month will boost adolescents who may be struggling with their own emerging sexual identities and reaffirms PUSD's commitment to their LGBTQ+ community.

Typical human services would include, but not be limited to: social services, shelter, economic support, employment and training, education, health and protective services.

- Commissioner Ford spoke to Gary Moody (Making Housing and Community Happen) and the Commission requested a future presentation from the organization.
- Commissioner Albrecht spoke to Councilmember Madison and his district liaison and requested that Staff (Osborne) provide an update when the membership of the EdTech Committee is finalized, due to committee reassignments after the election.
- The Commission requested a presentation from Jennifer O'Reilly-Jones (Homeless Programs Coordinator, Housing) about what the City is doing about bad weather shelters and other initiatives for the homeless population.

January 2021:

- The Commission voted to approve the recommendation of the temporary shelter and bridge-housing proposal, and submission of a letter to the EDTech Committee.
- The Commission received a presentation from the Housing Department about alternatives to the Bad Weather Shelter, that is not operating this year due to COVID-19.
