Design Commission Update:

Commissioner Sales updated the commission on ongoing projects presented at the Design Commission.

8. COMMISSIONER COMMENTS

Vice Chair Lim urges everyone to go to their local redistricting workshops to get more information about how the redistricting is going to take place. Commissioner Beal shared the upcoming WPRA meeting time. Commissioner Floyd updated the commission regarding the upcoming retirement of the Metro CEO, also stating July may be his last meeting. Commissioner Potter updated the commission regarding

his recent conversation with Councilmember Hampton. Commissioner Bowles-Martinez is looking forward to the July meeting to discuss the PUSD-DOT Coordination meeting, requesting traffic impact update, to assess who is being impacted by the opening or closing of schools and businesses around schools, to see if transportation needs are being met.

9. CHAIR'S COMMENTS

Chair Morrissey updated the commission on Assembly bill 550 and would like to see a continuation of exploration of automated enforcement from the City.

10. STAFF UPDATE

Director Rubio- Cornejo informed the commission the department has received an HSIP grant in the amount of 1.6 million dollars for pedestrian enhancements throughout the City. Staff will be advancing CIP projects, in which the public can provide feedback and input on a number of Capital Improvement Projects. Meeting schedules and additional information will be posted on the Transportation website as well as shared with the commissioners. Staff continues to work on the Parking strategic plan, and in the coming months staff will be reaching out to local businesses in different districts to seek their input and feedback.

11. ADJOURNMENT

On the Order of Chair Morrissey, Commissioner Sales supported the motion and Vice Chair Lim seconded, the motion passed unanimously to end the meeting at 6:04 p.m.
