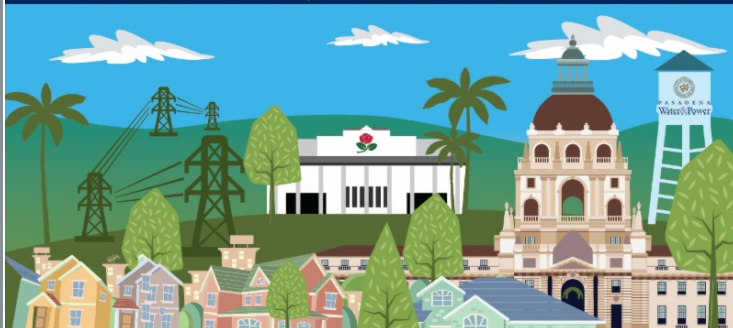

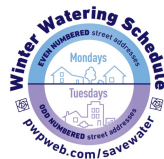
The new winter watering schedule begins November 1. Your watering day will be depend on your home address. Please see below.

### WINTER WATERING SCHEDULE BEGINS NOVEMBER 1

As a reminder, Pasadena's new Level 2 Water Supply Shortage Plan is now in effect. PWP reminds you to adjust your watering activity to reflect the Winter Water Schedule which begins on Monday, November 1st.



To balance the water demand on the City's water system and to prevent all properties from watering on the same days, Pasadena has adopted a new "odd/even" alternating day watering schedule as follows:

- **On Mondays**, watering is limited to those with **even-numbered** street addresses (for example: 4840, 9996, 24 1/2)
- **On Tuesdays**, watering is limited to those with **odd-numbered** street addresses (for example: 8889, 231, 8745 1/2)

Please note that these restrictions do not apply to certain exemptions, which include:

- Landscape irrigation zones that exclusively use low-flow drip type irrigation
- Watering or irrigating by use of a hand-held bucket or a hand-held hose equipped with a water shut-off device
- Watering for very short periods of time for the express purpose of adjusting or repairing an irrigation system
- Maintenance of trees as necessary to sustain their health and viability
- Maintenance of landscape for fire protection

With temperatures rising, PWP is reminding customers of the importance of energy conservation during days of extreme heat. During peak hours of 4 PM to 9 PM, please consider:

- Set your thermostat at 78 or higher
- Close curtains and blinds
- Turn off unnecessary lights
- Unplug devices that are not being used
- Avoid using major appliances like dishwashers and dryers
- Charge your electric vehicle BEFORE peak hours

### YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR STATE-FUNDED RENT AND UTILITY ASSISTANCE - APPLY TODAY

The financial impacts of the pandemic continue to affect many California residents. To assist those who may need help paying rent and utility bills, the State has increased the funding for its low income programs. The CA Covid-19 Rent Relief Program and the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program are still accepting applications, and we encourage those who meet the income qualifications to apply.

- **CA Covid-19 Rent Relief Program:** Offers assistance with past due and future rent and utility bills. Available to renters who meet the qualifying income levels and/or landlords who rent to eligible tenants.
- **Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program:** Offers a one-time credit (per year) towards utility bills and no-cost home improvement services. Available to homeowners and renters who meet the qualifying income levels.

## CELEBRATE "AMERICA RECYCLES DAY" WITH OUR REFRIGERATOR/ FREEZER RECYCLING SERVICE



In observance of America Recycles Day on November 15th, PWP encourages you to choose the most environmentally-friendly methods of recycling large appliances, like refrigerators. Did you know that almost all of the materials in your refrigerator can be recycled?

PWP's Refrigerator/Freezer Recycling Service is available all year round, and allows you to arrange for a free pickup when you're ready to recycle your old, functioning refrigerator or freezer. After being removed from your home, your refrigerator or freezer will be handled using the most advanced and environmentally responsible methods. All remaining recyclable materials will be reclaimed for reuse.

PWP will also give you a \$75 rebate when you replace your old refrigerator with a new, qualifying ENERGY STAR® certified model, plus a \$15 "Buy Local" bonus for purchasing it in Pasadena. ## CALIFORNIA EV REBATE PROGRAM CHANGES



Starting on November 2, the California Clean Fuel Reward "point of sale" incentive will decrease from \$1,500 to \$750 for those who purchase or lease a qualifying electric vehicle. If you are considering a cleaner, more fuel-efficient electric vehicle, now is the time to make the switch! Simply visit a participating retailer for an instant incentive off of your purchase price.

The good news is that funding has been restored for California's Clean Vehicle Rebate Project (CVRP), and those who purchase or lease a qualifying electric vehicle can get a rebate of up to \$2,000.

Additionally, you may be eligible for PWP's residential electric vehicle rebate of up to \$1,500 and an electric vehicle charger rebate of up to \$600. To learn more about the available federal, state, and local rebates, visit our Electric Vehicles page.
