LOS ANGELES COUNTY MAKES CHANGES TO VOTING PROCEDURES

No longer limited to one day and a specific location, voters can vote up to 10 days before the election and can vote at any Voting Center in Los Angeles County. The mechanics of voting have changes too.

How to vote in L.A. County in 2020

Los Angeles County is modernizing your voting experience for the March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary Election by replacing traditional polling locations with Vote Centers. This new way of voting increases the number of days to vote from one day to eleven days, provides voters the flexibility to vote at any Vote Center location in Los Angeles County, and provides voters full language services and expanded accessibility.

There will be 24 Vote Center locations in and around Pasadena, with 4 Vote Centers open from Saturday, February 22nd to Tuesday, March 3rd. The remainder of Vote Centers will be open for 4 days from Saturday, February 29th to Tuesday, March 3rd. Los Angeles County residents can vote at ANY Vote Center in Los Angeles County. Pasadena Vote Center information is listed below. Note: Your traditional polling location may NOT be a Vote Center this year, so be sure to check the list below.

How we vote is also changing. Vote Centers will look and feel like traditional polling places but implement modern features to make voting easier and more convenient. The County's new vote system allows voters to cast their ballot on a touchscreen ballot marking device, which then gets printed on a paper ballot for counting. For added security, the touchscreen device is not connected to the internet. The touchscreen device provides easy-to-follow instructions.

US CENSUS INVITATIONS ARRIVE IN MARCH

Your response is important

The U.S. 2020 Census Day is April 1st! Data collected is used to determine fair political representation in government and the annual distribution of over \$675 billion in federal funds to support vital community services. After the 2010 census, Pasadena received over \$400 million in federal funding.

This year, you will receive an invitation to **complete your census survey on line**. If you haven't responded by April 8th, you will be sent a reminder letter and paper questionnaire.

The Census Bureau is required by law to protect any personal information. The answers provided on your questionnaire can only be used to produce statistics. The Census Bureau will NEVER ask you for your Social Security number, donations, or bank/credit card numbers.
