Dear Friends,

We were excited to have three days in a row without any Pasadena deaths earlier this week, but then had the highest day of new cases (55) on Thursday. Some of these spikes are likely due to the increased availability of testing, together with mandatory testing in our skilled nursing and assisted living facilities. Fortunately the Huntington Hospital continues to have remaining COVID-19 capacity which allows the City the ability to gradually ease restrictions. The point: we are still in the thick of the crisis so need to continue to be agile and adapt to these dynamic circumstances.

Below is the new Health Order issued by our Health Officer Dr. Goh which allows all Lower-Risk Retailers to open for curbside pick-up, and the opening of trails and other recreational activities (including the Rose Bowl loop) as long as folks follow the prescribed protocol. Pet groomers may open for curbside pick-up as well!

Please remember to take all of the precautions to stay safe while venturing out to these new activities and stay home when you can. Face coverings are required when in public places but optional when walking your neighborhood as long as you maintain appropriate social distancing.

Yesterday, Pasadena Health Officer Dr. Goh issued an updated Health Order allowing all Lower-Risk Retail Businesses to open for curbside sales. All Lower-Risk Retail Businesses that sell goods and services to the public may only provide these goods and services to the public via curbside, doorside, or other outdoor or outside pickup, or via delivery. Members of the public are not permitted inside a retail Lower-Risk Retail Business.

In addition to retail curbside sales, pet groomers may reopen with curbside drop-off, and car washes may open for business with strict protocols. All of these businesses must implement and post the required Public Health Reopening Protocol for Curbside Retail, Pet Groomers, and Car Washes.

Outdoor recreation activity at parks, trails, and other open spaces is allowed but must comply with any access or use restrictions established by the Health Officer, City Manager, or other entity that manages the area to reduce crowding and the risk of COVID-19 transmission.

Use of shared outdoor facilities for recreational activities including golf courses, tennis and pickle ball courts, shooting and archery ranges, equestrian centers, model airplane areas, community gardens, and bike parks, including any associated parking lots, may reopen provided the facility implements any physical distancing protocol approved by the Health Officer prior to operation. The City expects to have tennis courts, pickle ball and archery open by this Saturday once the signage and website regulations are complete

The following types of higher-risk businesses, recreational sites, commercial properties and activities, where more intense and prolonged person-to-person contacts are likely to occur shall continue to be closed:

- i. Bars and nightclubs that do not serve food and the portions of wineries, breweries and tap rooms that provide tastings;
- ii. Gyms and fitness centers;
- iii. Movie theaters, live performance theaters, concert halls and venues, stadiums, arenas, gaming facilities, theme parks and festivals;
- iv. Bowling alleys and arcades;
- v. Personal grooming establishments (barbers, hair salons, nail salons);
- vi. Massage or body art establishments;
- vii. Indoor and outdoor playgrounds for children,

except those located within a childcare center;
viii. Community centers, including public pools;
ix. Indoor and outdoor flea markets and swap meets;
x. Indoor museums, indoor or outdoor children museums, gallery spaces, zoos and libraries;
xi. Indoor malls and indoor shopping centers, including all stores and vendors located therein regardless of whether they are an Essential or a Lower-Risk Business.

ROSE BOWL LOOP REOPENS TO THE PUBLIC

Social Distancing will be enforced

This week, the City of Pasadena reopened the Rose Bowl loop for pedestrians, runners and cyclists. Users must abide by the following guidelines:

- Practice physical distancing and provide at least six feet of space at all times.
- Face coverings should be worn-even when exercising-as long as your airflow is not restricted.
- Gather with members of the same household only.
- Alert one another when passing by and allow room to safely pass.
- Users must also take their trash with them to protect other loop users, staff and wildlife.

Staff will be positioned along the loop to make sure users are abiding by the guidelines listed above.

The loop is open from 6 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., and parking is available in Lot I. Parking is limited to 90 minutes and will be strictly enforced. The loop is closed to vehicular traffic, except for vehicles accessing the COVID-19 testing site and Brookside Golf Course, which are guided through by traffic monitors.

Meal delivery service focuses on older adults

On April 24th, Governor Newsom announced a collaborative meal delivery service for California's older adults. The service will provide meals to adults

65 and older and adults 60-64 who are at high risk for COVID-19 and who are unable to access meals while staying at home. Additionally, the program will support local restaurants and other food providers who have closed or are struggling to remain open due to COVID-19 mitigations.

Program costs are reimbursed by the federal and state government through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Public Assistance (PA) program. Program cost breakdown is as follows: 75% FEMA share, 18.75% state share, and a required local share of 6.25%. The program runs through June 10, 2020, per FEMA's current approval.
