This week, our first Thursday monthly constituent coffee will take place via Zoom Thursday, September 2nd at 8:00 a.m. If you would like to participate:



# Redistricting Pasadena

## **CITY RECEIVES PRELIMINARY CENSUS NUMBERS FOR REDISTRICTING**

On August 12, 2021, the United States Census Bureau released 2020 Census Data results to the states. The City's Redistricting Consultant, National Demographics Corporation (NDC), has started processing the data release and organizing the information into a user friendly format.

On August 19, 2021, as part of a Redistricting Task Force meeting, NDC presented information on the newly released census data, entitled "Population Estimates", with total and by district population provided.

The City's preliminary population reported by US Census is 138,699 ("2020 Census Estimates"). This is different from a previous population estimate of 141,866 that was based on American Community Survey Data ("Original NDC Estimates"). As a reference point, the City's official population in 2010 was 137,122, so the preliminary population shows an increase of 1,577 residents. Click here to see the [Population Estimates](#).

It is important to note that the reported US Census population data is still not final: the State of California must reallocate and include certain population counts back to local cities (i.e. incarcerated individuals). Once finalized this will be provided as part of the required block-level redistricting data for cities to use to complete the redistricting process. The anticipated release of the final redistricting data by the state is scheduled to occur in mid to late September.

The Task Force is in the process of adding an additional meeting date in September (tentatively September 18th) to discuss the preliminary census data and receive further community of interest input from residents.

**TENTATIVE SCHEDULE FOR SPECIFIC PLAN STUDY SESSIONS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS PUBLISHED**

Last year, the Our Pasadena Team presented draft concept plans and preliminary land use regulations and development and design standards via an online virtual platform and webinar for each of the Specific Plan areas: Central District, East Colorado, East Pasadena, Fair Oaks/Orange Grove, Lamanda Park, Lincoln Avenue, North Lake, and South Fair Oaks.

The Team also presented the preliminary regulations and standards to Design and Northwest Commissions for feedback.

**CITY COUNCIL APPROVES NEW ALTERNATING WATER SCHEDULE TO ADDRESS**

## DROUGHT CONDITIONS

On Monday, August 16, the Pasadena City Council unanimously approved a proposal to implement the Level 2 Water Supply Shortage Plan under the Pasadena Municipal Code and to establish a voluntary water reduction target of 15%, which aligns with the state's reduction goal. The Plan is effective immediately.



As part of the Pasadena Municipal Code, the Level 2 Water Supply Shortage Plan restricts outdoor watering to two days per week from April to October and one day per week from November to March.

To balance the water demand on the City's water system and to prevent all properties from watering on the same days, the following alternating watering schedule was approved:

- Even-numbered street addresses are limited to watering only on Mondays and Thursdays
- 
- Odd-numbered street addresses are limited to watering only on Tuesdays and Fridays

As the water supply situation throughout the state of California continues to worsen, with less rain forecasted and water sources dwindling, Pasadena is poised to take the necessary steps to preserve its limited water supplies to meet the community's drinking water needs.

Approximately 60% of Pasadena's water comes from imported water sources supplied by the Metropolitan Water District—which issued a Water Supply alert on August 17. The move to "alert" status is a call for the region to safeguard storage reserves and for water agencies to do their part to reduce water use.

The City recently introduced the Water Savers Team, which consists of water conservation specialists who visit locations throughout town where there have been reports of water waste and help evaluate households on how they can improve their outdoor watering situation. In the past three months, the PWP Water Savers have reached more than 3,000 customers.
