Re: Pasadena Public Records Act Request 13508

Dear Mr. Shaverdian,

My firm has been retained to respond to some public records act requests. This letter is written in response to your Public Records Act request received on July 1, 2020, which sought “a copy of [Integral’s application for a cannabis permit] and all related documents...”

The City has documents responsive to your request. The Public Records Act permits a local agency to withhold from disclosure records that are exempt from disclosure, or portions of such records that are covered by an exemption. (Cal. Gov. Code, § 6250 *et seq.*) The City will be withholding records from disclosure, in whole or in part, pursuant to one or a combination of the exemptions listed below:

- A. Personnel, medical, or similar files, the disclosure of which would constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, are exempt from disclosure pursuant to Government Code Section 6254(c), as well as other similar information protected by the privacy provisions of Article I, Section 1 of the California Constitution, incorporated into the Public Records Act exemptions through Government Code Section 6254(k).
- B. The records contain information that is exempt from disclosure pursuant to Government Code Section 6255, as the public interest served in not disclosing the information clearly outweighs the public interest served by disclosure, as set forth in *Times Mirror Co. v. Superior Court* (1991) 53 Cal. 3d 1325; *Rogers v. Superior Court* (1993) 19 Cal. App. 4th 469; *California First Amendment Coalition v. Superior Court* (1998) 67 Cal. App. 4th 159.
- C. Copyrighted material, the disclosure of which is exempted or prohibited pursuant to federal or state law. (Cal. Gov. Code § 6254(k)).

All non-exempt portions of the records will be disclosed to you. The City anticipates producing the records to you no later than July 17, 2020.
