

**CITY OF PASADENA HEALTH OFFICER ORDER
FOR THE CONTROL OF COVID-19**

**LIMITED STAY AT HOME ORDER
TO SLOW THE SPREAD OF COVID-19**

**RESTRICTIONS ON DINING ESTABLISHMENTS, PERSONAL CARE SERVICE
ESTABLISHMENTS AND PRIVATE GATHERINGS**

This Order Issued: November 19, 2020

This Order is in effect as of 12:01 AM November 20, 2020 until rescinded in writing by the Health Officer.

Please read this Order carefully. Violation of or failure to comply with this Revised Order is a crime punishable by fine, imprisonment, or both. (California Health and Safety Code §120295.)

SUMMARY OF THE ORDER: California is in a State of Emergency because of the COVID-19 pandemic. The spread of Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) is a substantial danger to the health of the public within the City of Pasadena. COVID-19 can easily spread between people who are in close contact with one another. Everyone is at risk for becoming ill with COVID-19, but some people are more vulnerable to serious illness, including pneumonia and organ failure, or death, due to their age, physical state, and/or health status.

The City of Pasadena Health Officer (“Health Officer”) has issued a number of Orders to help slow COVID-19’s spread, protect vulnerable individuals, and prevent the healthcare system in and around the City of Pasadena from being overwhelmed. The Revised Safer at Home Orders, dated March 22, 2020 and supplemented April 11 and May 15, 26 and 29, June 11, 18 and 28, 2020, and July 1 and 14, 2020 issued by the Health Officer, as well as other “Safer at Home” orders issued by other jurisdictions have proven to slow the spread of COVID-19. At this time, California, Los Angeles County, and Pasadena are experiencing an unprecedented rate of increase in confirmed cases of COVID-19. This significant surge in cases has resulted in an increase in hospitalizations and deaths.

This order imposes limited hours of operation for restaurants, breweries and bars, consistent with modifications allowed through Tier 1 (Purple) of the Blueprint for a Safer Economy, issued by the California Department of Public Health (“CDPH”) on August 28, 2020.

This order imposes, or re-imposes, restrictions on personal care service establishments.

Except as provided for herein, all previous Orders of the Pasadena Health Officer remain in full force and effect.

UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF THE CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTIONS 120175 et seq., AND THE PASADENA MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 8.04.010, THE CITY OF PASADENA HEALTH OFFICER ORDERS:

1. This Order requires that all restaurants, breweries and bars must close for onsite dining between the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. Takeout and delivery services are permitted to continue during these hours.
2. This Order prohibits personal care services that require the client to remove their face covering, such as for facials and shaves.
3. This Order limits indoor occupancy of all other personal care services, such as nail salons, body waxing and tattoo parlors and estheticians, to 25% capacity as measured by the maximum permitted occupancy pursuant to the California Fire Code for each establishment. Personal care service establishments must continue to see clients by appointment only. Personal care service establishments are still encouraged to provide outdoor services as much as possible because current scientific evidence appears to indicate a general lower risk of COVID-19 transmission outdoors, compared to indoors.
4. This Order amends the Health Officer Order dated October 15, 2020 re Private Outdoor Gatherings to limit social gatherings to 15 attendees. All other restrictions set forth in the Health Officer Order dated October 15, 2020 remain in full force and effect, including but not limited to:
 - a. Gatherings should be limited to no more than three households
 - b. Gatherings should be held outside and last no longer than 2 hours
 - c. Attendees should maintain at least 6 feet physical separation from all other attendees who are not part of the same household or living unit
 - d. Face coverings must be worn by all attendees over age 2 years at all times to the extent practicable, barring the exceptions listed in the State Health Officer Order
 - e. Singing, chanting and shouting are strongly discouraged
5. All previous Orders of the Pasadena Health Officer, as revised, supplemented and/or amended, remain in full force and effect, except as provided herein.
6. This Order's intent is to continue to ensure that City residents remain in their residences as much as practicable, to limit close contact with others outside their households in both indoor and outdoor spaces. All persons who can telework or work from home should continue to do so as much as possible during this pandemic. All non-essential offices must continue to operate remotely, without in-person operations. Nothing in this Order prohibits members of a single household from engaging in activities together, but gatherings of people who are not part of a single household or living unit are subject to restrictions, within the City of Pasadena Public Health Jurisdiction, except for the limited purposes expressly permitted by this Order.

7. People leaving their residences as permitted by this Order must strictly comply with physical distancing measures, including: maintaining six feet or more of distance between individuals from different households, frequently washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or using hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol, and wearing a cloth face covering over the nose and mouth whenever there is or can be contact with others who are non-household members in both public and private places, whether indoors or outdoors, for the purposes of source control.
8. This Order applies to all persons within the City of Pasadena under the Health Officer's jurisdiction.
9. Violation of this Order is a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment, fine or both under California Health and Safety Code Section 120295. This Revised Order will be enforced by the City of Pasadena Police Department, City Attorney/City Prosecutor's Office, and/or any other agency designated by the Pasadena City Manager for enforcement.
10. If any subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Order (or any other prior Order) or any application of it to any person, structure, gathering, or circumstance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, then such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Order (or any other prior Order).
